In the four directions, we acknowledge this network (above) forms the foundation to support the learning of respect, relationships, responsibility and reverence. These foundations enhance the learning and well-being of our students and the needs of the Elders in coming to an understanding of Residential Schools and Reconciliation.

Respect (core competency Personal Social):

- Where we begin with self and then ripples out to embrace family, community and the world.
- Acknowledge the traditional unceded territory of the First Peoples...
- Maintaining a safe, healthy, inclusive environment.
- Caring for our home and the surrounding environment.
- Being sensitive to the needs of others by showing empathy.
- Self-assessment is intended to be an opportunity for students to reflect on their own strengths, which encourages a growth mind-set.

Relationships (core competency Communication):

- Speaks to our connection to all of creation.
- Valuing the gifts and teachings, which come to us through our relationships with those of different ages, ancestry, colour and family.
- Inclusivity of all learners.
- Considering the needs of Elders and children in our actions and activities.
- Welcoming visitors with honour and consideration.
- Connects people to each other and the environment.

Responsibility (core competency Communication):

- When we understand what enhances well being and what diminishes it, we can take responsibility for strengthening it. We honour the teaching of responsibility by:
- Modeling and sharing protocol with others.
- Caring for ourselves, for others, the community and the environment.
- Serving as witnesses in the development of learning, which includes activities where students use thinking, collaboration and communication to solve problems, address issues, or make decisions. (Self-assessment)
- Recognizing the loss and separation for Aboriginal families and communities who attended residential school.

Reverence (core competency Thinking):

- We honour the teaching of reverence by:
- Serving others for the benefit of all.
- Developing our own gifts and facilitating that development in others.
- Being grateful for our learning (self) and our learning community (family, school, community).
- Being respectful of Aboriginal knowledge by creating a more respectful and balanced community.

Reconciliation

Inquiry Question: What are authentic ways we can honour the reconciliation process in our hearts, thoughts and deeds?

Respect (core competency Personal Social):

"Big Idea:" It is our responsibility to understand and respect that reconciliation means different things to different people. Schools need to teach Aboriginal history, even though there are sensitive topics. In learning together, we facilitate the process of truth and reconciliation. {It is the journey of the people who attended residential school and our journey to honour and respect their stories and learn..}

Pre-contact

Inquiry Question: What are the many way we can acknowledge the history and knowledge of the land pre-contact and work to share the knowledge with each other?

Relationships (core competency Communication):

"Big Idea:" 9000 years ago, before Canada and European Contact, there were Aboriginal people living here. Specific to our area are the Sto; lo People which include the Kwantlen First Nation, Matsqui First Nation, Leq'á:mel First Nation and Scowlitz First Nation. They each had their own education, community and cultural values based on the local area where the people lived. Aboriginal people are connected to the land and this influences their community. The local resources are important to community and trade.
